This Policy is quite a large, detailed document and is available from Council's Engineering and Technical Services Department on request. Detailed below are the broad details of the policy.

1 NAME OF POLICY

This Policy shall be known as Young Shire Council Directional Signs Policy.

2 APPLICATION OF POLICY

This Policy deals with directional signs located on any land within the Young Shire area.

This Policy does not directly apply to land within Olympic Highway or Road reserves where the control is vested in the Roads and Traffic Authority (RTA). However, any application for a sign within such a road reserve, which complies with the provisions of this plan will receive Council's support to the RTA.

3 COMMENCEMENT OF POLICY

This Policy was adopted by Council on 17th February 1999 and became effective from 1st March 1999.

4 POLICY OBJECTIVES

Council has a responsibility to cater for the needs and guidance of travellers whether local, intra-state, interstate or international. To this end Council's objectives are:

- To assist in promoting the Young Shire area to the travelling public through informative, clear, low-key signage.
- To ensure adequate sign-posting is provided for the travelling public.
- To establish a consistent approach to the erection of directional signage and structures without being to the detriment of the urban neighbourhood amenity or the rural landscape.

5 STREET NUMBERS

The policy requires the placing of street and rural addressing numbers on signs.
