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## **1 STREET STALLS, RAFFLES**

Each organisation be limited to one (1) street stall/event per month. Permission must be sought by organisers desiring to set up tables, stands, vehicles or the like on town streets. No more than one (1) raffles and one (1) street stall/event be permitted on any one (1) day. Under this Policy street stalls, raffles and busking are only permitted in the locations listed below.

## **2 BUSKING**

Permission will only be granted to buskers raising money for a community organisation or charity. Permission must be sought by buskers prior to the event. No electrical equipment or amplifiers are permitted.

## **3 LOCATIONS**

Street stalls shall be limited to the island in front of the Westpac building and/or in the road blister treatment area in Lynch Street outside the South West Slopes Credit Union building. No street stall shall be permitted in any other location or in front of any commercial premises.

## **4 FURNITURE**

A limit of one (1) table and two (2) chairs per street stall applies. Where an umbrella is to be utilised as part of the street stall it shall be a minimum height of 2100mm, shall not protrude beyond the edge of the table at any time and shall be securely attached to the table to prevent falling.

## **5 ADVERTISING**

Each authorised street stall shall be included in the Council column in the local newspaper prior to the event.

## **6 NON COMPLIANCE OR NUISANCE**

All persons and organisations approved to occupy public land under this Policy shall operate in such a manner as to not cause offence or nuisance to the persons using the CBD in the normal course of their day and duties. Council reserves the right to revoke permission and request that persons or organisation remove themselves and all equipment should non compliance with the Policy be identified.

## **7 VARIATIONS**

Council or its delegated Officer (the General Manager) may consider variations to these conditions on written application to Council.

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
