LEGISLATIVE REQUIREMENTS:

The provisions pertaining to tree removal, lopping or pruning are contained within Clause 5.9 (Preservation of trees or vegetation) of the *Young LEP 2010* and Section 4.3 (Development requiring tree removal or lopping) of the *Young DCP*. These provisions should be read in conjunction with each other.

A person must not ringbark, cut down, top, lop, remove, injure or wilfully destroy any prescribed tree or other vegetation (as defined by a development control plan), without:

- (a) development consent, or
- (b) a permit granted by the Council.

The Young DCP defines a prescribed tree as a tree that is:

- (a) five (5) metres or more in height at any point above the ground, or
- (b) has a trunk diameter of 200 mm or more when measured 1.5 metres above the ground level, or
- (c) has more than one (1) trunk, where one (1) or more of the trunks has a diameter exceeding 100 mm at a height of one (1) metre above the ground level.

NOTE: This excludes some particular trees and noxious weed species, and does not apply to trees within the RU1 and RU3 zones. However, despite these, or any other any exemptions within the YLEP or YDCP, separate approval may be required under other legislation, such as the *Native Vegetation Act 2003*. This Act may apply when clearing native vegetation or impacting on an ecologically endangered community. If you are unsure, please contact either Council or the Office of Environment and Heritage for further advice.



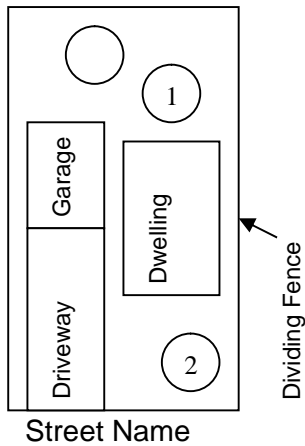
